This resource guide does not provide every resource that can be found within a specific community.

After being released from incarceration, that individual will need to reinstate any benefits prior to incarceration. For example, the individual may need to apply for state health insurance, Social Security benefits, SNAP (Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program), and other appropriate programs. Other considerations when leaving prison are housing, locating the individual's probation or parole officer, clothing, and transportation.
